Although we live in an electronic age, when handwriting seems almost a lost art, there are still a lot of good reasons to learn to write well in "longhand".


This book is appropriate and fun for kids who already know how to write, but we think it will be especially fun for children who are not yet writing. Each pair of pages features a hand-drawn pattern. Children are invited to "continue" the pattern, in whatever way makes sense to them. The idea is to get used to the notion of repeated shapes and figures, and to experience the concept of "pattern" very broadly. Drawing patterns is somewhere in between actual drawing and writing, and is a great way for kids to develop a feeling for the kinds of thinking and coordination that will be necessary as they advance toward actual cursive writing.


There's no right or wrong way to use this book — the main thing is, have fun!


































